



Rolf Harris, Gary Glitter, Stuart Hall and Jimmy Saville. What say you, sir?





Rolf Harris, Gary Glitter, Stuart Hall, and Jimmy Savile are individuals who were involved in high-profile cases related to sexual offenses. These cases highlight the importance of addressing and preventing sexual offenses, protecting victims, and holding perpetrators accountable. They also serve as a reminder that no individual, regardless of their fame or public image, should be exempt from facing justice for their actions.
